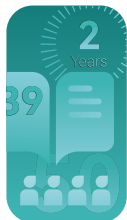
About the Jingshi Academy

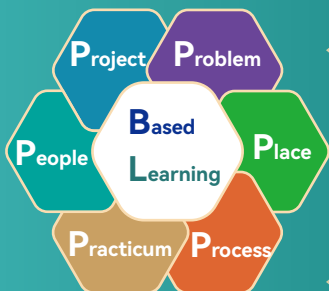

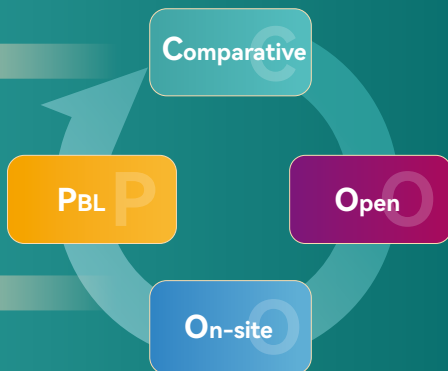
